### **FEES**

Registration and fees paid by May 22<sup>nd</sup> = \$15 per youth

Registration and fees paid between May 23<sup>rd</sup> up to 5 pm of the day prior = \$20 per youth

Same day registration and fees or paying on site\* = \$25 per youth

Webelos Overnight Activity = \$5 additional per youth

\*Same Day Registration is ONLY permissible if there is space available. Please call in advance.
