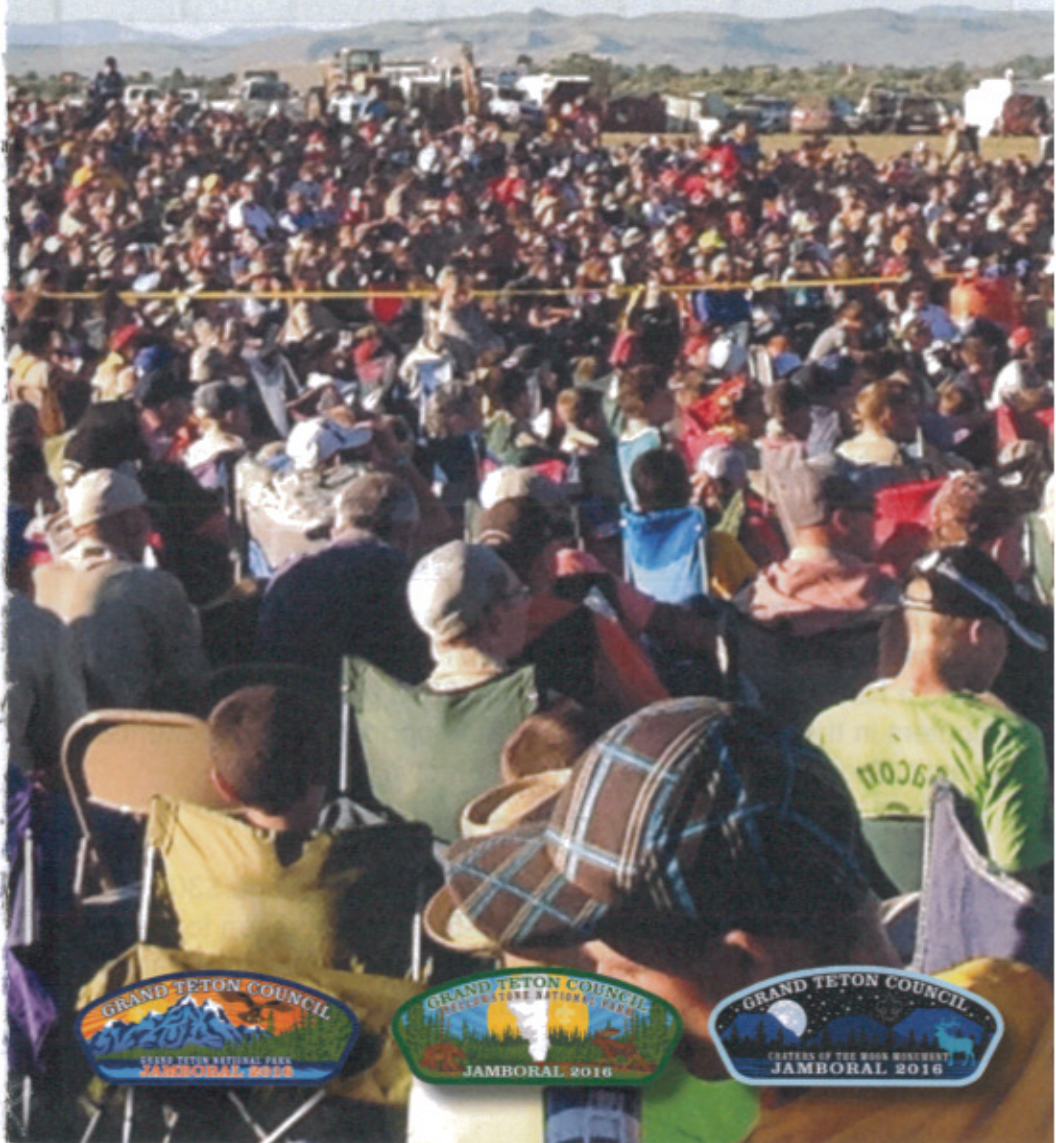

What is a Jamboral?

A Jamboral is a council-wide overnight encampment for Scouts in the Grand Teton Council. This year all Boy Scout Troop, Varsity Teams, Venture Crews and Explorer Posts are invited to participate. This event will celebrate the 100th anniversary of the National Parks System in America.

When and Where?

May 20-21, 2016

Camp Stolworthy – Firth Idaho, the same location as the 2013 LDS Encampment.

Forty thousand Scouts across the nation are gearing up for the National Jamboree in the summer of 2017, but not all boys can attend a National Jamboree. Jamboral 2016 gives Scouts and Scouters in the Grand Teton council the opportunity to experience a gigantic Scouting adventure right in their own backyard!

GATHERING PATCH WITH ROCKERS FOR EACH GROUP

All rocker patches are limited in number.

WOOD BADGE GATHERING ROCKER -

For adult leaders who have attended Wood Badge and/or attend the gathering. (Limited number)

EAGLE SCOUT GATHERING ROCKER -

For any Scout who attends the Eagle Scout gathering.

ORDER OF THE ARROW FLAPS AND ROCKER -

Set of 3 can be purchased for the first time at the gathering. The Jamboral flaps complement the Jamboral CSP set.

SILVER BEAVER COLONY CSP AND ROCKER -

Can be purchased at the Silver Beaver Booth All Silver Beaver recipients and guests are encouraged to stop by the Silver Beaver Colony booth to enjoy a few minutes of fellowship and camaraderie.

CEDAR BADGE ROCKER -

For those attending the Cedar Badge Gathering.

Additional Information

REFUND POLICY – 50% of all fees are refundable up to May 1, 2016. Fees can only be substituted for another person after that date.

EARLY PAY FEE - Take note that there is a significant savings for everyone who signs up by March 31, 2016. Sign up everyone who you can by this date. Additional Scouts and leaders can be added after this date at the higher fee. Early registration allows us to order materials in volume for a cost savings.

JAMBORAL 2016 UNIT GUIDE – This will be downloadable from the Council Website, www.tetonscouts.org. This will include a site map, suggested equipment lists, health and safety instruction, take note of the pre-Jamboral activities that you might do before this event that will enhance your experience.

ARRIVAL AND CAMP SETUP – Motorized vehicles will be allowed to enter the camp to unload equipment from 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 pm on May 20th. After 1:00 pm no motorized vehicles will be allowed into the camping area. All vehicles must be removed from camping area and into the parking area by 2:00 p.m. Vehicles arriving after 1:00 pm will need to transport their equipment by hand or by any non-motorized cart or wagon. There will be no exceptions.

PATCH TRADING – Patch collecting and trading is a tradition throughout Scouting with thousands participating worldwide. There will be many opportunities for patch trading to happen during the Jamboral.

SAFETY AND SECURITY – No ground fires will be allowed. All burning must take place on a surface that is fireproof and raised at least two feet off the ground. Open fires are discouraged. If the ground and plants are dry, all open fires may be prohibited. You are encouraged to do all cooking on propane camp stoves. If briquettes are used they must be taken out with you, do not put them in a dumpster.



The Jamboral security team will be on constant patrol. If Scouts are found outside of their camp area after taps and before reveille they will be held in the Security area until the local law enforcement can take them to their facility. Scouts who participate in un-Scout-like behavior at any time will be dealt with in a similar manner.
